EYE-CATCHING GRAPHICS!

This eye-catching, one-of-a-kind exhibit features a van and trailer wrapped with orange, red, and yellow flames enhancing the entire outer shell of the vehicles. The van is wrapped in illustrations depicting the seven regions of Texas that are highly threatened by wildfire (Big-Bend area, Gulf Coast, Hill Country, Panhandle, Piney Woods, Prairies and Lakes, and the South Texas Plains), and the trailer wrap depicts homes in wildlands and firefighters fighting Urban Wildland Interface fires.

VIDEO & INTERACTIVE CD

The exhibit trailer opens to two sides each displaying a television set which airs a seven-minute DVD video featuring the character "Tex Forester." Tex relates a tale of devastating fires and shares step-by-step firewise knowledge that helps prevent the loss of lives and homes to fire. The exhibit also includes two computers running a CD interactive game which allows players of all ages to test their firewise knowledge.

Interactive Materials

Bright, color-infused interior illustrations graphically depict wildfire and its devastation to home and family. U.S. and Texas maps show locations of Urban Wildland Interface fires, and the construction panel features firewise construction materials. A model home features defensible space and a defensible space wheel is mounted on the exhibit doors to allow the public to estimate the amount of defensible space needed around a home.
